Sardinella aurita, (Valenciennes, 1847) Round sardinella



I am one of the largest species of sardinella, averaging 23 to 28cm in length. My maximum reported length is 33 cm.





I am a coastal water species that prefers saline waters, usually with maximum temperatures above 20 °C.



I am found from the Mediterranean to the bay of Saldanha in South Africa. I

I live near the surface of coastal waters down to 350 m deep. I am gregarious, I like to move in schools that carry out seasonal migrations, following the water temperature. I come to the surface during the night. am common along the African coasts, from Mauritania to the Gulf of Guinea. In the western Atlantic, my distribution stretches from New York to Argentina, including Mexico and the Caribbean.



I mainly eat plankton, in particular copepods, crustacean larvae (e.g. *mysidaceae*) and more rarely certain algae.



I am sold fresh, frozen, salted, canned, or in the form of oil or fishmeal. Humans are not the only ones who like me; therefore, I am also widely used as bait for longline fishing ...
