

## Get to know more about me.....!

Sparus aurata (Linnaeus, 1758) Gilthead seabream



Adult, my common length is between 20 and 50 cm. My maximum known length is 70 cm.





I am a sedentary fish, rather solitary but I sometimes form small aggregations. I am a bentho-pelagic species. I am in the coastal zone, the Posidonia meadows, the rocky and sandy bottoms. I commonly swim at depths of around 30 m, but adults can live up to 150 m depth. Due to my euryhaline (I support variations in salinity) and eurythermal (I support temperature variations) capacities, I can move around brackish areas (river estuaries, lagoons).



## My favorite regions

I can be in the Eastern Atlantic: near the British Isles, off the Strait of Gibraltar, in Cape Verde and around the Canary Islands. I am also visible in the Mediterranean, and in the Black Sea.

Diet

I am a carnivore. My teeth allow me to eat shells and carapaces. I eat bivalve molluscs (mussels, oysters), crustaceans, sea urchins and fish that I dig up with my tail. Sometimes I also taste seaweed and sea green plants.

I am a "protandrous fish": first male, I wait for my sexual maturity between 1 and 2 years (size of 20 to 30 cm), then I become female around 3 years old (that means, at a size of about 30 to 40 cm), for a life expectancy of 11 years.

I am a very popular fish for humans. According to the text of the European Union, dated 12/21/2006, the capture of any individual less than 20 cm is prohibited regardless of the technique used (DORIS).
