Trachurus trachurus, (Linnaeus, 1758) Atlantic horsemackerel





I measure between 30 and 40 cm in average. My maximum length is 70 cm!



I am a benthopelagic species, which means that I am found from the surface to depths of 100m. In winter I can live deeper, usually down to 300m, while in summer I swim closer to the coast. I can form large schools with my peers, rather on sandy bottoms.



You will find me all over the eastern Atlantic, from Norway to South Africa where I can stretch around the Cape of Good Hope and along the southern coast of the Indian Ocean to Maputo in Mozambique. I am also present in the Mediterranean and Black Seas.



My size allows me to vary my food. I eat fish, crustaceans and small cephalopods. I also have been observed carefully preying jellyfishes: I wait until they are weakened, when they come to shore.

I hunt in schools and I am more active at night than during the day.



The decree of March 19, 2007 from the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries fixes at 15 cm the minimum legal catch size of Atlantic horsemackerel in France.
