ABOUT THIS EVENT

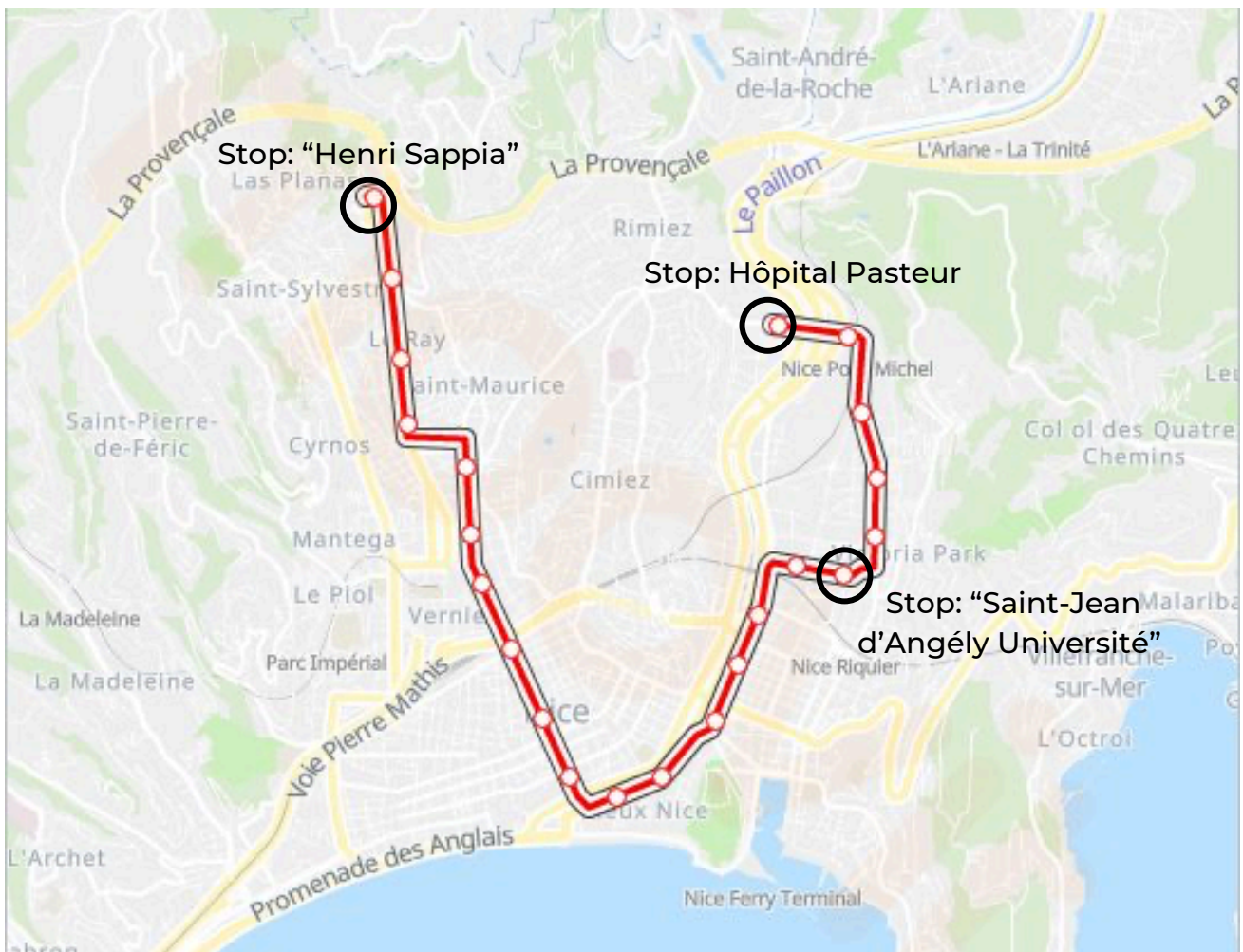

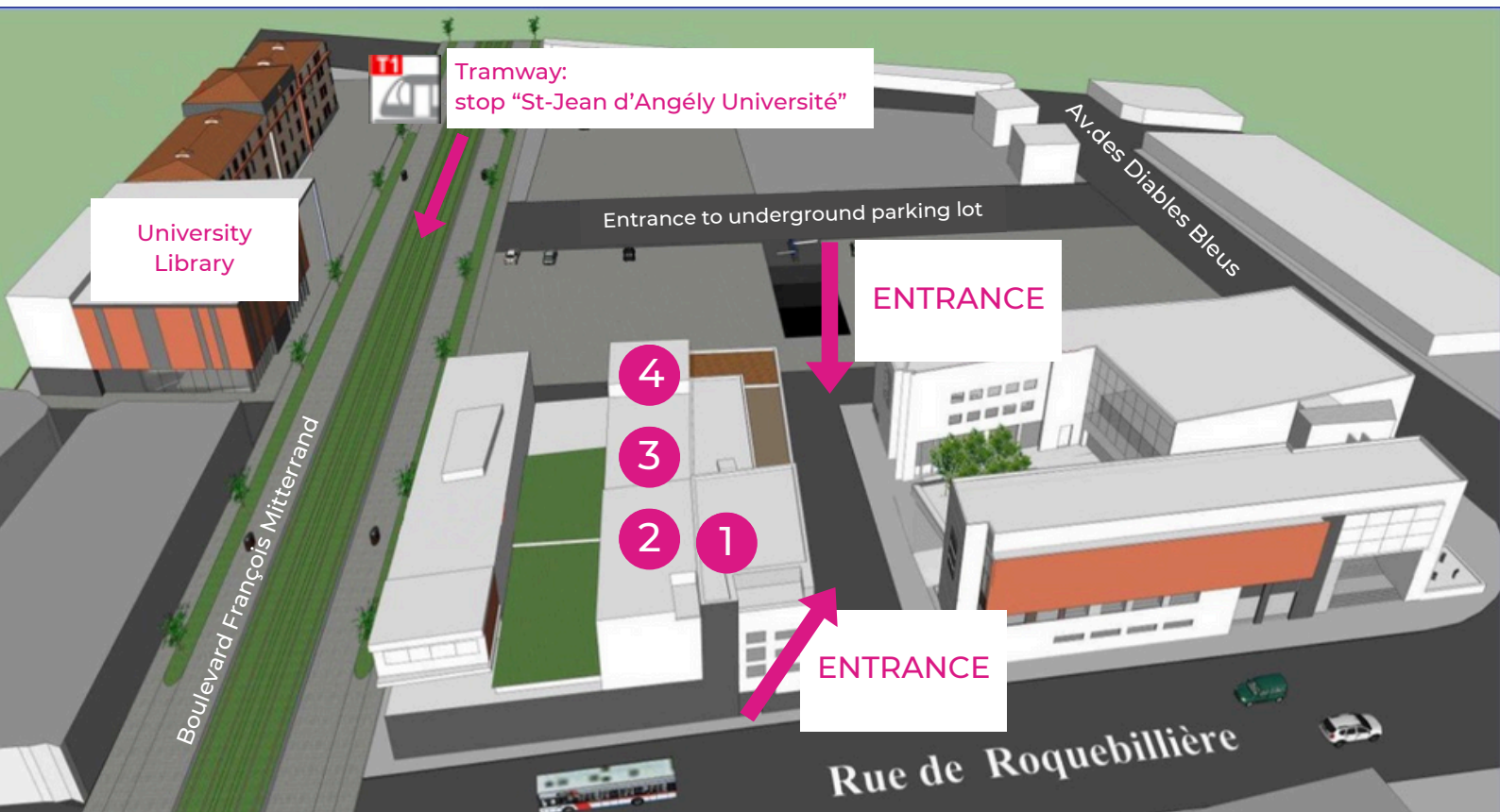
How to get to the event venue?

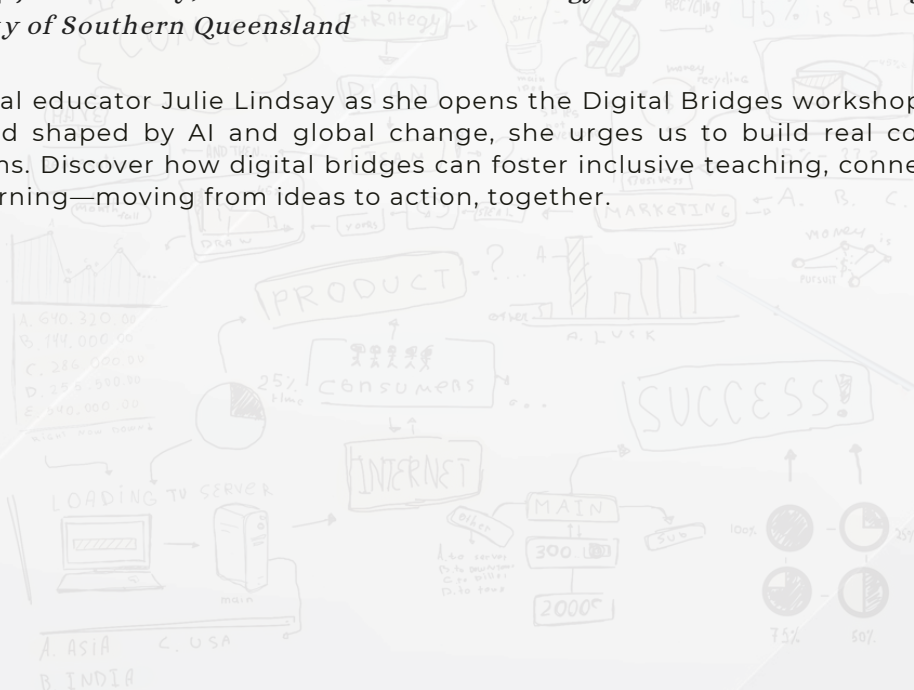



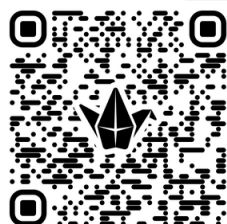

Between sea and mountains, Nice is the capital of the French Riviera, the city's charm comes from its exceptional landscapes, climate as well the cultural facilities, shops and architectural heritage.
