


ABOUT THIS EVENT




How to get to campus Saint-Jean?

VIRTUAL EXCHANGE AND BLENDED MOBILITY IN EUROPEAN UNIVERSITY ALLIANCES: OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES

Forms of online collaborative learning, such as Virtual Exchange and Blended Mobility, are becoming increasingly popular in European university education. Virtual Exchange (VE) refers to the numerous online learning initiatives and methodologies which engage learners in online collaborative learning and interaction with partners from different cultural backgrounds as part of their study programmes. COIL (Collaborative Online International Learning) is one form of VE. Blended Mobility combines stages of online collaboration with short periods of physical mobility and has been popularised by the introduction of Blended Intensive Programmes (BIPs) in the Erasmus+ programme.

Although VE has been employed in university education for over 25 years, it has received much greater attention since the recent COVID-19 pandemic and many practitioners are exploring its potential to develop foreign language and intercultural competence and to form part of Internationalisation at Home initiatives. In the context of European University Alliances, VE has enormous potential to promote opportunities for multilingual collaborative learning and exchange between partners, and also to function as a complement and preparation for physical mobility programmes between member institutions (O'Dowd, 2023).

In this presentation I will use key publications from the literature to explore how VE and Blended Mobility can promote foreign language learning as well as global citizenship as part of Internationalisation at Home initiatives. I will also outline how VE and Blended Mobility can be integrated effectively into European University Alliances and how International Relations Offices can play an effective role in this process. Finally, I will reflect on the challenges educators face as we try to use this activity to deal with issues of diversity and inclusion and to establish equitable relationships with partners from other countries.

TRANSPORTS

FROM THE AIRPORT TO THE CITY CENTER



To get from Nice Côte d'Azur Airport to the city center of Nice, you have several options:

1. Tram

Tram Line 2 (Direction Port Lympia) from Terminal 1 or Terminal 2 to city center (e.g., Jean Médecin or Alsace-Lorraine station)

Duration: ~25 minutes Cost: €1.70 (single ticket)

Buy the tickets at the machines at trams stops. Or download the Lignes d'Azur application in your mobile phone.

1 ticket allow for connections with other public lines within a period of 74 minutes (buses and tramways). You need to validate the ticket each time you board, even for connections.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: You don't have to buy the Airport Ticket which is 10 euros. You can simply buy the 1,70 euros ticket via the application, even though you come from the airport.

2. Bus

Airport Express Bus #12 or #620 to Nice city center

Duration: ~30 minutes Cost: Around €2.50

3. Taxi

Duration: ~15–20 minutes (depends on traffic)

Cost: ~€35–€40 (fixed rate)

Price-range for Lignes d'Azur (bus & tramways):

Single and Multi-Trip Tickets:

- Solo Ticket: €1.70 per person. Valid for a single journey with connections up to 74 minutes.
- Multi-Trip Ticket: €1.70 per trip. Allows loading of 1 to 100 trips, each with connections up to 74 minutes. Can be used by multiple passengers simultaneously; each passenger must validate their own trip.

Day Passes:

- 1-Day Pass: €7. Unlimited travel for 24 hours from the first validation.
- 2-Day Pass: €13. Unlimited travel for 48 hours from the first validation.
- 7-Day Pass: €20. Unlimited travel for 7 days from the first validation.
