



Thanks to the generosity of our partner ThermoFisher Scientific, we have been able to create 2 scholarships of excellence for students wishing to join the European Masters in Molecular Pathology.

The first, "Women in Molecular Pathology", is awarded based on gender. The second, "Equity Scholarship for molecular pathologists", is awarded based on social criteria.

Award

Both scholarships include a waiver^{*} of your tuition fees and an annual sum of €2,500 in year 1.

If the recipient attends classes regularly and achieves an overall average above 14 out of 20 at the final jury of the first year, the scholarship will be renewed for the second year with the same benefits (fee waiver and stipend).

Recipients of scholarships created with funds made available by Thermo Fisher Scientific will also be invited to participate in Thermo Fisher Scientific events if they wish.

Conditions of eligibility

Both scholarships are intented for students who want to join the first year of the European MSc in Molecular Pathology in 2025.

To be eligible, students will first have to submit their application for the European MSc in Molecular Pathology on the Université Côte d'Azur platform, e-candidat. Candidates will not need to wait for the outcome to send their scholarship application form.

Age and nationality restrictions do not apply.

- Merge your application form with your supporting documents (see list below)

Supporting documents

Scholarship for Women in Molecular Pathology

- A PDF copy of your academic transcripts for your last diploma or, if you are currently in the process of completing a degree, your overall grade for the 2023-2024 academic year
- A PDF copy of your valid passport

Equity Scholarship for Molecular Pathologists

- A PDF copy of your academic transcripts for your last diploma or, if you are currently in the process of completing a degree, your overall grade for the 2023-2024 academic year
- A personal statement explaining why you think you are eligible
- Plus one or several of the following documents, depending on your situation:



Proof of financial hardship (your last tax return) and/or

Proof of disability (medical statement provided by health professional/health organisation) and/or



Proof you care for another person who needs ongoing support because of longterm medical and/or condition, mental illness or disability



A valid visa showing refugee status
